

Student Eligibility:

- No previous knowledge of the Ukrainian language is required
- All cultural and religious backgrounds are welcome
- Students may enter at any grade (Grades 1 to 8)
- New registrations are accepted from students in Grades 3 to 8 until the end of October

Research shows that students who study a second language:
