Preamble

The Regina Catholic School Division's (RCSD) pastoral plan for ministering to Gender and Sexually diverse students follows the guiding principles as outlined in the documents:

- 1. Caring for Our Students and Staff: Creating an Atmosphere of Trust and Respect Around Issues of Sexual Orientation (Saskatchewan Catholic School Boards Association, 2015),
- 2. SCSBA Pastoral Response to Transgender Students (Saskatchewan Catholic School Boards Association, 2016)
- 3. SCSBA Student Alliances for Gender and Sexual Diversity Formation Protocol (Saskatchewan Catholic School Boards Association, 2016).
- 4. The Shared Protocol (RCSD and the Archdiocese of Regina, 2020)

We promote Church teaching and a theology and spirituality of communion with regard to gender and sexual diversity meaning we nurture "an ability to think of our brothers and sisters in faith within the profound unity of the Mystical Body, and therefore as 'those who are a part of me.' This makes us able to share their joys and sufferings, to sense their desires and attend to their needs, to offer them deep and genuine friendship" (Novo Millennia Ineunte #43).

To believe that the Son of God assumed our human flesh means that each human person has been taken up into the very heart of God.
