Definition

- 1. Communicable Disease** - an infection in humans that is caused by an organism or microorganism or its toxic products and is transmitted directly or indirectly from an infected person or animal or from the environment.

Category 1 Communicable Diseases

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| Acute Flaccid Paralysis | Encephalitis – vector-borne |
| Amoebiasis | Food poisoning of animal, bacterial, viral or chemical origin |
| Anthrax | Giardiasis |
| Botulism | Haemophilus Influenza Invasive disease - all typeable and non-typeable strains |
| Brucellosis | Haemorrhagic Fevers – viral |
| Campylobacteriosis | Hantavirus infections |
| Chickenpox | Hepatitis A |
| Cholera | Human Parvovirus infection |
| Clostridium Difficile infection | Infections associated with antimicrobial resistant organisms |
| Congenital Rubella syndrome | Influenza – lab confirmed |
| Coronavirus infections associated with severe Acute Respiratory syndrome | Legionellosis |
| Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease, all forms and other transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSE) | Leprosy |
| Cryptosporidiosis | Leptospirosis |
| Cyclosporiasis | Listeriosis |
| Diphtheria | Lyme disease |
