Preamble

All co-curricular, extra-curricular, and other school sponsored activities within the Regina Catholic School Division (RCSD) are an integral part of school operation. Students participating in these activities shall be responsible to the principal and staff in the same manner as during the regular school day unless otherwise noted in relation to the activity in question.

Application

RCSD supports schools in their efforts to design and implement standards and procedures for student conduct in accordance with *the Education Act*, Board policy, regulations pursuant to this application and teachings of the Catholic Church. These standards and procedures should assist students to contribute to the best of their ability to the realization of a Catholic Christian school community.

- 1. Responsibility of Students**
In the exercise of their rights of access to the schools of the division and to the benefits of the educational services provided within the school division, it is the responsibility of every student to cooperate fully with staff and other authorized personnel. Students are expected to treat all individuals with respect and dignity.
- 2. Accountability of Students**
Every student shall be accountable to the principal for general deportment while under the supervision of school staff including the time spent travelling between school and home.
- 3. Referrals Regarding Student Conduct**
In situations where a student's conduct may adversely affect their educational development and/or the well-being of other students, the principal may refer the matter to a disciplinary committee in accordance with *Section 153 of the Education Act*.
- 4. Replacement of Damaged Property**
A student who damages, destroys, or loses school division property through neglect or deliberate actions may be responsible for making payment for suitable repair or replacement, in whole or in part.
