CSCC Questions</p> <p>Questions from the MS Teams chat:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I know it may seem insignificant but, can we not figure out a small celebration for our Grade 8 students? Maybe outdoors in the school fields, only immediate family members and social distancing adhered to? It is a big milestone for these kids. • Why is busing within cohorts not allowed? • If we cannot bus with cohorts, why are we still busing jointly with other schools? It would seem to be the same level of risk. • Should the need to go to Phase 4 again happen, would you be looking at addressing some of the concerns? High school as 100% asynchronous. Would that be changed? • Are they self-isolating the entire classroom now if there is a positive COVID-19 in the classroom? • Will the staff be now wearing the medical grade masks like the public school to not be considered a close contact? • In general, how is the scoring of students related to other years? If positive, will plans be taken to understand what improved and delivered in the future and if negative, will it influence any actions to improve that may be different than the feedback provided by all? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Ministry of Education will provide guidelines in the next little while. The Response Planning Team have sent a survey out to all school divisions looking for feedback. • They have indicated that guidelines will be similar to last year. All schools are planning celebrations. • Ministry guidelines do not allow for any school transportation at this point. • This agreement was in place prior to the pandemic and has been supported in the transportation guidelines. All safety guidelines are followed on the busses. • Schools will continue to adapt and change to meet the needs of all students. Many schools provided a blend of asynchronous and synchronous learning for students. We try to balance family needs, screen time and number of devices in a household. • Yes. The Saskatchewan Health Authority has directed that when there is a positive case in a classroom the entire class must self-isolate 14 days from last date of contact. • Staff will have access to the medical grade masks once they arrive. All staff have received shields at the beginning of the year. All staff have had training. • As much as students have had to adjust and adapt along with teachers, the scores are very similar to previous years. We are in the process of gathering all first semester (Q1&Q2) data.
