

The Regina intersectoral Partnership | Support Worker

Contract positions (40 hours/week – July & August); potential for extension (10 hours/week - September – June) @ \$23.00 - \$25.00/hr. Evening and Weekend work required.

This is an exciting opportunity to work with The Regina intersectoral Partnership. TRiP is a model utilizing a targeted collaborative approach to crime prevention, reduction and community well-being. It is an innovative approach to mitigating or eliminating varying levels of risk and victimization in a collaborative work environment.

This position provides support for young people under the age of 18, by focusing on coordinated service support, reduction of barriers to pro-social activities and school engagement.



Duties:

For the summer months (July-Aug), this position will focus on supporting young people in activities including transportation to camps; structured and unstructured outings and creative learning opportunities.

During the school year (Sept-June), this position supports the case plans designed with the family including things such as: encouraging school attendance and engagement, assisting the implementation of individualized supervision/support plans for children and families; engaging and facilitating opportunities for children to participate in pro social activities.

Act as a mentor and positive role model.

Requirements:

- Post-Secondary education in Social Work, Education and/or Social Sciences/Human Services is preferred.
- Experience working with children/youth who are in a place of vulnerability.
- Engage children and families, be respectful, non-judgmental and consistent in their interactions.
- Ability to commit to the full term of the contract is imperative.
- Understanding of risk factors.
- Work independently, be self-motivated and collaborate with the support team.
- Knowledge of pro social activities available to young people in the community and how to access.
- Strong organizational and communication skills are critical.
- Ability to document client interaction and complete written case plans/progress notes in a timely fashion.

- Basic understanding of applicable legislation such as the Child and Family Services Act.
- Respect the importance of confidentiality.
- The ability to seek direction, follow case plans and consult is essential.
- Availability to attend case planning meetings and act as a liaison may be needed at times.
- A valid driver's license, access to a vehicle and an appropriate insurance policy.
- Support Workers are responsible for mileage, associated vehicle maintenance and insurance costs.
- Police Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check is required.
- The successful applicant is responsible for their own benefits and associated income tax requirements.
- Individuals who identify as First Nations ancestry are strongly encouraged to apply.
