What credits do I need to graduate from LeBoldus?

English Program

- English Language Arts A10, B10, ELA20, ELA A30, B30
- History 10
- A social science at the 20 or 30 level
- Science 10 and a 20-level science
- Math 10 and Math 20
- Catholic Studies 10, 20 and 30
- Wellness 10 OR Physical Education 20 or 30
- Social Studies 30 or Native Studies 30
- Plus a minimum of 8 electives
- You need 24 credits and, of these 24, at least 5 of your credits must be at the 30-level

French Immersion Program

- English Language Arts A10 or B10, ELA 20, ELA A30 or ELA B30
- Français 10, 20, 30
- Histoire 10, Sciences Sociales 30 and a social science at the 20 or 30 level (Histoire 20 is recommended)
- Sciences Naturelles Fr 10 and a 20-level science
- Mathématiques 10 and 20
- Etudes Catholiques 10, 20, 30
- Mieux-Etre 10 or Wellness 10 OR Physical Education 20 or 30
- Plus a minimum of 7 electives
- You need 24 credits and, of these 24, at least 5 of your credits must be at the 30-level
- 12 of your 24 credits must be in French

With my 24 credits, will I get into any post-secondary program I want?

- NOT NECESSARILY!! Be careful. Each institution has its own unique prerequisites; you must ensure that you meet entrance requirements specific to the program that you are interested in.
- See a Guidance Counsellor for assistance.
- Start using myBlueprint for career and post-secondary planning.

How do I register for AP courses in Grade 12?

- LeBoldus offers AP courses in ELA 30, Calculus 30, Computer Science 30, Psychology 20/30, Studio Art 30 and French 30.
- Talk to the teachers to find out more information about workload and expectations.
- Check off the appropriate boxes on your registration form and then enter them into MSS.
- Please note: Access to AP courses is limited.

What are the Social Sciences?

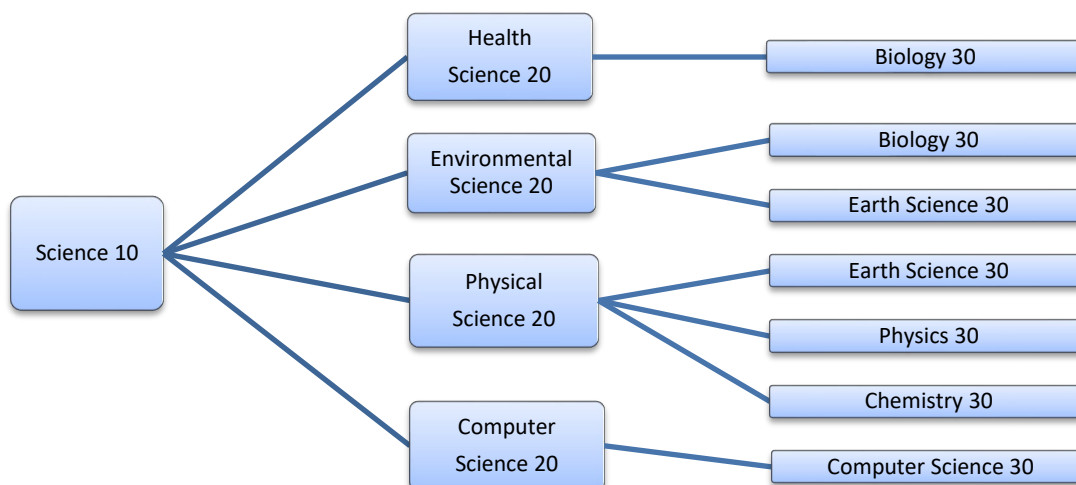
- History/Histoire 20, Psychology 20 or 30 (AP also counts), or Law 30 - you must take one of these courses in order to meet graduation requirements.
- **Or**, you may take Social Studies/Sciences Sociales 30 **and** Native Studies 30 (one will count towards the Social Science graduation requirement and the other will meet the Canadian Studies requirement).

How can I find out more about elective subjects?

- Talk with teachers who teach these classes and read the course descriptions in our Program of Studies booklet (available on our LeBoldus website).
- Choose carefully - if you change your mind later on, the elective you want could be full or it might not fit into your schedule.

Which 20 or 30 level science should I take?

- It depends on your strengths, interests and career plan; read the course descriptions carefully.



When are summer school forms available?

- The registration forms – including fees and details – are available in early June.
- Option 1: RCSD Learning Online offers online summer courses during July and August. These are full-length courses so you do not have to have taken them previously.
- Option 2: Regina Public offers face-to-face summer school classes during the month of July (pending COVID-19 restrictions) and the location will be determined in June. You need at least 30% to be eligible to re-take 1 or 2 classes at summer school.

What if I failed a grade eleven subject in semester one?

- If you failed a compulsory subject (and you're not going to summer school), indicate the subject you need to retake on the registration form.
- Plan on taking a full course load each semester of Grade 12 to make up for failed courses and to ensure that you have 24 credits to graduate.
- Summer School is highly recommended so that you can stay on track and finish high school in four years
- You need to take a minimum of 8 courses in Grade 12 to be eligible for Honour Roll.
